BYLAW NO. 4-2006

Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE ENTERING INTO AGREEMENT WITH OTHER MUNICIPALITIES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A DISTRICT BOARD OF REVISION.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 is hereby authorized to enter into agreement with the Rural Municipality of Moosomin No. 121, the Rural Municipality of Martin No. 122, the Town of Rocanville and the Village of Welwyn and the Rural Municipality of Spy Hill No. 152 for establishment of a District Board of Revision.
- 2. The Reeve and Administrator of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 are hereby authorized to sign and execute the attached agreement, Exhibit "A".
- 3. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the 1st day of January, 2007.

For the Establishment of a District Board of Revision.

1. **DATE OF AGREEMENT**

This Memorandum of Agreement is shall come into force and take effect first day of January, 2007.

2. PARTIES TO AGREEMENT

This agreement is made by the following parties:

 OF THE FIFTH PART
- -andTHE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF SPY HILL NO. 152
 Province of Saskatchewan OF THE SIXTH PART

(hereinafter referred to in the aggregate as the "municipalities")

3. PREAMBLE

WHEREAS the municipalities hereto voluntarily and collectively intend to establish a DISTRICT BOARD OF REVISION (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), to hear and decide appeals received, pursuant to section 226 of *The Municipality Act* from within the municipalities to this agreement.

4. **AUTHORITY**

The District Board of Revision is being established under the provision of section 222(1) of *The Municipality Act*.

5. COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD

- (1) Board
 - (a) There shall be a maximum of six persons appointed to the board, with each party to this agreement required to appoint one person:



- (i) Each party to this agreement shall notify the secretary of the Board in writing of their appointment on or before January 31st of each year.
- b) No more than three persons appointed to the board shall sit, at anyone time, to hear appeals.

(2) Secretary of the Board

The municipalities hereby agree that Larry Lang shall serve as the secretary to the Board.

6. BOARD'S AND SECRETARY'S REMUNERATION AND EXPENSES

(1) Training

The expenses of Board Members and the Secretary to attend authorized training sessions shall be shared equally by the parties to this agreement, with the rate of remuneration to be in accordance with clause 6(3) herein.

(2) Hearings

The cost of the Board and Secretary to sit to hear appeals and for the secretary to process and serve the necessary documents involved with an appeal or involved with the general operation of the Board shall be proportionally shared by each party to this agreement based on the amount of time spent by the Secretary and the Board to deal with all the appeals of the respective municipality, with the rate of remuneration to be in accordance with clause 6(3) herein.

(3) Rate of Remuneration

- (a) "hourly remuneration" of \$20.00 per hour;
- (b) "meal allowance" in accordance with those rates approved by the Saskatchewan Public Service Commission; and
- (c) "travel allowance" in accordance with those rates approved by the Saskatchewan Public Service Commission.

7. POWER, DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES AND MEETING OF THE BOARD

- (1) The Board shall conduct itself in a fair and impartial manner; and
 - (a) the sitting members of the Board shall designate one of their number as chairperson;
 - (b) no sitting member of the Board who has a pecuniary interest, within the meaning of section 143(1) of *The Municipality Act*, in any land or improvement, the assessment or classification of which is the subject of an appeal to the Board, shall sit as a member of the Board on the appeal;
 - (c) a majority of the sitting members of the Board constitutes a quorum for the purpose of a sitting or hearing or conducting the business of the Board;
 - (d) the Board shall hear appeals, as far as possible, in the order in which the appeals stand in the list, but the Board may adjourn or expedite the hearing of any appeal where the Board considers in appropriate to do so;
 - (e) the Board shall act within section 225 through to section 242, inclusively of *The Municipality Act*.



8. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall come into force and be effective upon the signing and sealing of the municipalities to this agreement and shall be continuous, however, any party to the agreement may withdraw from the agreement by giving written notice to each party to the agreement by December 31st of any year.

- "Representative" means someone appointed to the committee. (ii)
- "Secretary-Treasurer" means the RM of Moosomin administrator. (iii)

REGISTERED OFFICE

2. The registered office of the Authority shall be located in the Rural Municipality of Moosomin in the Province of Saskatchewan.

FISCAL YEAR

3. The fiscal year of the Authority shall end on the 31st day of December in each year.

(i) An annual report of the operating revenue and expenses of the Authority shall be presented by the secretary-treasurer to the Moosomin Municipal Airport Authority Committee for approval by the 30th of January of the following year.

LEVY & SURPLUS

4. The annual levy of \$0.50 per capita will be invoiced to the participating municipalities or organizations by January 30th of each year and is payable within thirty (30) days. The R.M. of Moosomin No. 121 shall pay for all expenses incurred throughout the calendar year. If any surplus results from the operation of the Authority it shall be transferred to reserves for future capital projects.

REPRESENTATIVES

The Moosomin Municipal Airport Authority Committee shall be represented as follows, of which one shall be chosen as

R.M of Moosomin -1 representative R.M of Martin -1 representative R.M of Maryfield -1 representative R.M of Walpole -1 representative R.M of Rocanville -1 representative Town of Fleming -1 representative Town of Rocanville -1 representative

6. A representative from the Airport's Flying Club may attend the meetings and make proposals on required improvements to the Airport.

WITHDRAWAL OF MEMBERSHIP

7. This agreement may be terminated by any party, by giving one year written intention of their intention to withdrawal, at which time the annual per capita levy must be reviewed by the members of the Moosomin Municipal Airport Authority Committee.

GENERAL MEETINGS

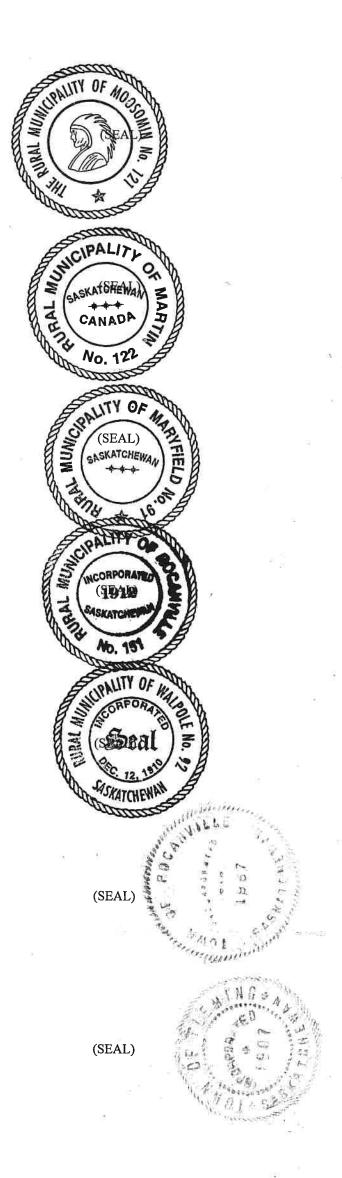

BYLAW NO. 2-2006

Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. In this bylaw the expression:
 - (a) "public highway" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by the Municipal Act;
 - (b) "motor vehicle" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by the Traffic Safety Act.
- No person shall operate a motor vehicle;
 - (a) at a speed greater than 50 kilometers per hour on that portion of a public highway within the Hamlet of Ste. Marthe; and
 - (b) at a speed greater than 60 kilometers per hour on that portion of of public highway described as follows: South of Section 28, Township 16, Range 31, West of the first meridian.
- 3. Signs indicating the maximum speed allowed shall be erected at the commencement of the speed zone area and signs shall be erected showing the end of the speed zone area.
- 4. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of this municipality.
- 5. Bylaw No. 2-91, passed on March 15, 1991, being a bylaw to regulate the speed of motor vehicles, is hereby repealed.

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE CLOSING AND SELLING OF A MUNICIPAL ROAD.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Subject to the consent of the Minister of Highways and Transportation, the Municipality, agrees to close and transfer the municipal road allowance lying east of section 16, township 17, range 30, west of the first meridian and the road allowance intersection at the north east of section 16, township 17, range 30, west of the first meridian on the terms and conditions set out in the agreement marked as Exhibit "A" which is attached to and forms part of this bylaw.

EXHIBIT "A"

AGREEMENT TO CLOSE AND SELL ALL OF A MUNICIPAL ROAD

This agreement made this 16th day of March, 2006.

Between:

The Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 ("the Municipality")

And

Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan Inc. Rocanville, Saskatchewan. ("the Purchaser")

Whereas the municipal road located to the east of section 16, township 17, range 30, west of the first meridian and the road allowance intersection northeast of section 16, township 17, range 30, west first of the first meridian is no longer required for use by the traveling public; and

Whereas access to other lands is not eliminated by this agreement; and

Whereas the Purchaser is desirous of acquiring the road and the municipality is prepared to close and transfer the same to the Purchaser, pursuant to section 13 *The Municipalities Act*, and

Whereas the Minister of Highways and Transportation has agreed to allow the municipality to close and transfer the road to the Purchaser, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Municipality agrees to sell and the Purchaser agrees to buy the road.
- The Purchaser shall pay the Municipality the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Thousand Dollars (plus GST for the road).
 GST number 119482909. The Purchaser, remits the GST payable on any land sale to Revenue Canada, and it should not be submitted with the payment.
- 3. The sale shall be subject to the laws of Saskatchewan and any applicable municipal bylaws or regulations.
- 4. The Purchaser agrees to accept the road in its present condition. The Purchaser agrees to save harmless and keep indemnified the Municipality and the Crown in right of Saskatchewan or either of them from and against any future expenses, damages, claims demands or judgments concerning this road.
- 5. The Purchaser covenants and agrees with the Municipality to;
 - a) incur all costs to convey title to the land and may require a review for intended land use by Community Planning;
 - b) consolidate the land with the adjacent existing title at the Purchaser's expense;

- c) be responsible for all Information Services Corporation (ISC) fees related to the transfer of the land; and
- d) erect and maintain throughout the terms of this agreement, at each end of the road, such signs as the Municipality may direct, to ensure that the general public is adequately warned that the road is closed.
- a) Any closing and transfer pursuant to this agreement is subject to the condition that, if the Crown or a Crown utility corporation in right of Saskatchewan or the Municipality requests the return of the road for use by the public as a municipal road, or any interests in the road that is necessary to enable Crown in right of Saskatchewan or a Crown utility or the Municipality to fulfill the purpose on which its request is based, must be returned to the Crown in right of Saskatchewan, without compensation.
 - b) Clause 6 a) pertains only if the land has not become part of a subdivision pursuant to *The Planning & Development Act*.
 - c) All costs associated with registering an interest pursuant to Section 6 shall be borne by the Municipality.
- The Purchaser shall, without charge, grant utility line easements as may be required by the Saskatchewan Power Corporation, Sask Energy and Saskatchewan Telecommunications for any existing lines.
