# BYIAW NO. 4 - 79

# A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR MUNICIPAL RAT ERADICATION.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151, in the Province of Sskatchewan, enacts as follows:-

## 1. In this bylaw:

- (a) "department" means the Department of Agriculture for the Province of Saskatchewan;
- (b) "municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151;
- (c) "owner" means a person who owns, occupies or controls any land or premises in the municipality;
- (d) "pest control officer" means a person appointed or employed by the municipality as a pest control officer.
- (e) "rodenticide" means any substance or mixture of substances approved by the department for use in preventing destroying, repelling or mitigating rats declared a pest under The Pest Control Act.
- 2. The municipality is authorized to purchase, keep on hand and distribute rodenticide in quantities deemed sufficient for the eradication of rats within the municipality.
- 3. The municipality may supply rodenticide to an owner within the municipality on such terms and conditions authorized by the council of the municipality.
- 4. The municipality is authorized to appoint or employ one or more persons as pest control officers and such persons appointed as pest control officers shall have the authority and power to take all such actions or measures necessary to eradicate rats within the municipality, and such persons are hereby appointed an officer within meaning of The Pest Control Act.
- 5. The persons appointed or employed as pest control officers of the municipality shall have all the powers and duties given an officer under The Pest Control Act.
- 6. The municipality is hereby authorized and empowered to enter into an agreement or agreements with other municipalities, a government, whether federal or provincial, or any agency of such governments for the joint action to eradicate rats as such an agreement may include:
  - (a) establishment of a joint committee or committees and the appointment of representatives to such committees to establish and manage a program to control and eradicate rates;
  - (b) the purchase of equipment, rodenticide and the appointment or employment of persons for the purpose of carrying out a program for the control and eradication of rats;
  - (c) the expenditure of funds to implement the agreement and to meet the expenses incurred under such an agreement.
- 7. Every owner within a municipality shall take the following measures to eradicate rats:
  - (a) provide suitable rodenticide stations wherever required on land or other premises owned, occupied or controlled by him, according to the recommendation of the department or a pest control officer of the municipality;
  - (b) keep rodenticide stations continuously stocked with an adequate supply to rodenticide in accordance with the recommendations of the department or a pest control officer of the municipality;
  - (c) take all necessary precautions to protect humans, livestock and other animals from the rodenticide;
  - (d) post the premises where rodenticide stations have been established with signs supplied by the municipality;

- (e) remove or destroy or alter any harborage or potential harborage for rate and shall do so in a manner recommended by the department or a pest control officer of the municipality;
- (f) report to the pest control officer of the municipality the existence or suspected existence of rats on land or other premises owned, occupied or controlled by him in the municipality and shall take such measures to eradicate rats as may be recommended by the department or a pest control officer of the municipality.

## BYIAW NO. 2 - 79

A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ROCANVILLE NO. 151 TO ESTABLISH AN OPERATIONAL PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE TOWN OF ROCANVILLE AND TO DEFINE THE DUTIES OF SUCH A BOARD.

Of ROCANVILLE

WHEREAS, The Councils of the Rural Municipality No. 151 and the Town of Rocanville deem it expedient and advisable that Parks and Recreation be under the management of an Operational Parks and Recreation Board;

NCW THEREFORE, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151, in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- 1. There shall be appointed by the Councils an Operational Parks and Recreation Board which shall be known as The Rocanville and District Operational Parks and Recreation Board.
- 2. The board shall consist of a minimum of Nine (9) members who shall be appointed by Councils immediately after the passing of this bylaw. Subcommittees shall be formed for specific duties, when necessary, with a board member as chairperson. The board shall appoint its executive officers.
- 3. The Councils shall appoint members from the residents of the Town of Rocanville, the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 and surrounding district. In the first year, four (4) members shall hold office for a period of one (1) year or until December 31st., 1979; four (4) members shall hold office for a period of two (2) years or until December 31st., 1980; and one (1) member shall hold office for a period of three (3) years or until December 31st., 1981. In each year thereafter, one (1) member shall be appointed to a three (3) year term and three (3) members to a two (2) year term.
- 4. Five (5) members shall constitute a quorum.
- 5. If, at the expiration of the term, any member of the board cannot find a suitable replacement, it shall be Council's responsibility to find such a replacement.
- 6. If any member of the board is absent for a period of three (3) consecutive regular meetings, unless excused by resolution of such board in session, then this seat shall be deemed vacant. If a seat becomes vacant for this or any other unforeseen reason, Council shall appoint a suitable replacement to fill such vacancy for the remainder of the term.
- 7. All orders and proceedings of the board shall be entered into books to be kept for that purpose and shall be signed by the chairperson officiating at each respective meeting and the secretary or acting secretary. Regular reports of the meetings shall be made to the Councils by the Council representatives to the board. Copies of regular meeting minutes shall be forwarded monthly to the Councils along with quarterly financial statements of the board.
- 8. The board shall meet in regular monthly sessions at a date to be establised by the board at the first meeting in each year. The board may hold special meetings at their discreation.
- 9. The financial year of the board shall commence on January 1st., and close on December 31st.

  Budgets shall be submitted by the various Recreational Facilities Boards to the Recreation Board on or before February 15th., of each year.

  By March 15th., a financial report of the past year and a Budget for the coming year shall be presented at an annual joint meeting between members of the Councils and the board.
- 10. The board shall carry out a threefold role within the district. This threefold role shall be;
  - (a) To plan and administer a District Parks and Recreation program on behalf of the Councils.
  - (b) To promote leisure activity in the district.
  - (c) To co-ordinate leisure activity in the district.

A variety of responsibilities shall be carried out to ensure fulfillment of the board's threefold role. These are listed in detail in the boards manual and shall be reviewed and evaluated once a year at the annual joint meeting between the Councils and the board.

- 11. The board shall receive complete and continuous moral and verbal support of the Councils so long as it continues to be active and dedicated in the fulfillment of its responsibulities. Office facilities and other support services may be utilized by the board whenever such facilities are needed.
- 12. The board shall be given complete authority to distribute all Recreation Grants (Municipal, Provincial and Federal) and all other monies collected through various board fund-raising activities, to the various Recreation Facilities Boards and other organizations within the district, once Councils have approved the Recreation Boards Budget.
- 13. The board shall have full responsibility as to the hiring and evaluating of a Recreation Director, if and when it is mutually decided by Councils and the board that the services of the said person are necessary.
- 14. The municipal auditor shall be the auditor of the board and all books, documents, records of transactions, minutes and accounts of the board shall, at all times, be open to his inspection.
- 15. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of the final passing thereof.

Now a contract had been completed with Logan Stevens Construction Ltd., of Yorkton, for the construction of the new building, for a total cost of \$62,008.00. Finances as such; \$23,500.00 from the sale of the municipalities residence, \$20,000.00 as previously set aside for this project, with the balance out of the 1979 budget.
- 2. Donald Reavie spoke breifly on the petition, stating that they felt there were more projects urgently required instead of a new office building, such as roads and more gravelling.
- 3. The chairman than opened the meeting for questions and comments to the elected council:
  - a) Why not a joint building with the Town of Rocanville? It was pointed out that periodic talks were held, then the town bought their present office. The location of the building could never be agreed upon, so evently the council decided to build on their own.

b) Why a library not attached?

- c) Why the new building is being built where it is, and not by the machine shop?
- d) Many other aspects of the construction were asked and answered by the council.
  e) Council asked the tatepayers as to why this petition against the office, because when the municipality gave \$20,000.00 towards the construction of new waiting rooms on the Rocanville areans and \$21,000.00 towards the construction of the swimming pool, no petition was received.
- Edwin Knuttila spoke breifly and gave a vote of confidence for the Reeve, Councillor and Sec-Treas.
- 5. Spring ratepayers informational meeting was discussed. It was moved by Maurice Kelly second by Edwin Knuttila that a spring ratepayers meeting be held in April. Motion Lost.

# BYLAW NO. 1 - 79

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE VILLAGE OF WELWYN FOR THE USE OF FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:~

It shall be lawfull for the Rural Municipalty of Rocanville No. 151 to enter into an agreement, the terms of which are attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" with the Village of Welwyn for the joint use of fire fighting equipment of the said Village of Welwyn in extinquishing fires within the limits of the said rural municipality, and the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer of the said rural municipality are hereby authorized to sign and execute an agreement, the terms of which are set out in Exhibit. "A" hereinbefore referred to.

## INDENTURE OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN:

THE VILLAGE OF WELWYN in the Province of Saskatchewan, the Town of the First Part;

and

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ROCANVILLE NO. 151 having its office in the Town of Rocanville, in the Province of Saskatchewan, the Rural Municipality of the Second Part:

WHEREAS the parties hereto are desirous of co-operating to carry out jointly a service, namely Fire Fighting, in which they have a common interest and which each of them could lawfully carry out alone within its own territorial limits;

AND WHEREAS by virtue of subsection 3 of section 202 of the Urban Municipality Act, 1970, and section 241 of the Rural Municipality Act, 1972, respectively, they have the power to enter into an agreement to do so:

WITNESSETH that in consideration of the covenants, promises, agreements and undertakings hereinafter contained, on the part of the parties hereto,

IT IS AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD, that:

THE VILLAGE OF WELWYN, of the First Part, will;
(1) furnish fire protection services to the ratepayers of the said Rural Municipality, namely, those situated on Sections 1 to 15 inclusive and sections 22, 23 and 24, all in Township 16, in Range 30, West of the Principal Meridian.

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ROCANVILLE NO. 151, of the Second Part, will; (1) annually give the said Village, 15% of their Inter-Municipal Fire Protection Program Grant received from the Province of Saskatchewan, for providing fire protection services to the above mentioned locations.

(2) at all times have the Rocanville Fire Brigade and pumper truck used as a back-up unit to provide fire protection services to the above mentioned locations.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO, that;

(1) a call for the Village fire truck and equipment to fight a fire within the territorial limits of the village shall always take precedence over a call for its use within the territorial limits of the rural municipality.

(2) this agreement shall be effective on the date of signing thereof.

(3) by mutual consent regulations, not inconsistent herewith, may be adopted for the better carrying out of the purpose and interest of this agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF and by virtue of a bylaw passed by the Council of the Village of Welwyn and a bylaw passed by the Council of the Rural Municipality of Rocanville No. 151, the said parties have each caused its corporate seal to be affixed hereto attested by the signatures of its proper officers in that behalf.
